We have this past month been allowed to engage in a culture of mercy.

Amina Ayad says in her book, Healing body and Soul (pp419):

"Fasting is thus a remedy for the suffering of the soul- a time to draw closer to Allah so as to purify it from sin, while purifying our bodies from toxins..."

The opportunities exposed to us are innumerable and the onus is on us to continue to build upon these gifts along the path of righteousness.


But in order to fully utilise and honestly engage in these opportunities as individuals and as a community, the Quran has to be our constant and most trusted companion. It is only then that we will really live according to our true fitra (nature) and discard the false coverings.

Abu Ammaar Yasir Qadhi comments on this in his book, Introduction to the Sciences of the Quran:

"...they have made the Quran a sacred heirloom; to be treasured in exotic and expensive covers, yet to be uninhabited by the best of covers-their hearts; to be recited and listened to in the best and most melodious of voices, yet to ignore it's meanings; to be placed high above all other objects in a room, yet to occupy the lowest station in their daily lives; to be read when a death has occurred, yet to be ignored by the living; to be written in the fanciest of scripts and on the most expensive papers, yet to be heedless of its commandments and prohibitions"

This development and unfurling of the human being to a renewed state during the month of the Quran is not strange or new, but true advancement. We need only look to Creation in order to witness renewal in all its forms. As the caterpillar sheds its chrysalis to form a butterfly so too we cannot remain stagnant. Change will come by any means. But only if we are cognisant will we reap the benefits, and lest we forget:

Allah (SWT) says in Surah 20:124-126:




"And whoever turns away from My Remembrance (the Quran), for him is a life of hardship, and We shall raise him up, on the Day of Judgement, blind.
